Courage to move on

long time ago, I had an experience that greatly discouraged me as a young school leaver who was relatively young in the faith (less than 10 years as a Christian). I almost renounced my faith in Christ. I was facing many challenges during that period, especially my inability to secure admission into a higher institution of learning five years after leaving secondary school. Most of my colleagues had gained admission. Some had even graduated while I was still battling with entrance examinations. As a youth leader in my Church, some of those I was leading in the fellowship had secured admission while I had none. When I was eventually given admissions, I had no money nor a sponsor to help me pay the fees. Virtually everyone around me disappointed me.

In a bid to remain active in the Church, I summoned the courage to attend a particular Saturday workers' preparatory class, just to enable me to lead the youth fellowship the following Sunday. My intention was to leave immediately after the class. However, my immediate supervisor forced me to wait after the preview class. Thank God I waited. For the first time I heard a message with just one-word title, DISCOURAGEMENT. The message aptly described my situation. It was as if someone had reported me to the minister of God that day. After the minister ended his message, I had to ask God for forgiveness and thank my leader who insisted that I should wait till the end of the service. This is one of the discouraging situations I have faced in life. But thanks to God as the rest is now history.

According to Grant Cardone in his book, The 10X Rule, courage is the "quality of mind or spirit that compels people to face dangerous situations despite fear. People rarely feel or are described as courageous before the event that compels them to act in this way. Rather, they're referred to as such as a result of taking action regardless of their fears." The opposite of courage is discouragement or fear.

It is obvious that the times we currently live in is full of discouragements and dreads. This period is fulfilling the scripture that says, "the just shall live by faith" (Rom. 1:17). Many individuals, families, organisations and government at various levels are being confronted by a lot of challenges, ranging from insecurity, poor level of education, high poverty rate,

unemployment, business failure, socioeconomic and political instability to pandemic. The list is endless. Whatever situation you find yourself, I have a word from the Lord Jesus Christ to you. He said in John 16:33, "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." Christ has overcome and in Him alone we have our victory. Do not renounce your faith because of the temporal challenges currently confronting you. Trust in the Lord, and you shall soon sing the victory song. Do not give in to discouragement and do not listen to the enemy's voice. Your tomorrow shall be better. Do not give up, only believe and victory shall be yours.

Courage comes to those who act, not to those who think, wait, procrastinate, or wonder. Nobody wants to transact any business with anyone who gives in easily or is full of excuses. The only way to overcome these trying times is to take positive actions towards achieving your goals and objectives. Seek godly counsel from trusted fellows where necessary. Avoid peer pressure and do not allow depression. Suicide is never the answer. So, continue instantly in your prayers to God. Do you plan to start a good project? Don't wait till every condition is perfect. Start something no matter how small, and be disciplined. No one wants to invest in a project whose initiator is inactive, lack the courage and confidence to move ahead.

Someone advised that you should do what you fear the most, and you will overcome fear because F.E.A.R. means False Evidence (Expressions) Appearing Real. Fear not, only believe in yourself, believe in God and believe in your godly projects and you will soon share your testimony. The world is waiting to hear your testimony. Success does not need explanation and failure has no alibi. With God's help you will succeed despite the varying degree of discouragements

One of the many challenges, according to Femi Oyebode, a distribution staff of the BSN, is the bad state of roads across the country. During a recent trip from Jos, the Society's distribution truck broke down at Omale in Kogi State. "This happens frequently because of the many bad roads," he said.

He added that another major challenge is armed robbery attacks. Several times, they had been robbed of their money and other valuables on the road. Other challenges include: high cost of diesel and increasing cost of repairs of the distribution trucks which frequently breaks downs due to bad roads.

Bibles are distributed to the nooks and crannies of Nigeria. The BSN has five Bible distribution centres across the country. They are in Lagos, Ibadan, Abuja, Jos and Aba.

The BSN will continue to defer all odds to ensure the Bible is distributed for life transformation with the support of God and well meaning Nigerian.

Let's lead by example President

The President of the Christ Apostolic Church Worldwide, Pastor Samuel Oladele has committed most of his life to the work of the ministry of Jesus Christ, rising through the ranks to head one of the country's first indigenous Pentecostal Churches. In an exclusive interview with the SOWER magazine, he tasked Christian leaders to live an exemplary life and reject gifts from corrupt people, as through these acts the church will help rid the society of social decadence. Excerpts:

You joined the ministry at a very young age of 14. What motivated you to join the ministry that early or were you compelled to become a pastor?

Not at all. I was practically "prayed" into existence and when I got to know that the Lord would have me come into ministry sometimes in the future, I felt it was better to prepare for that future rather than waste my time doing other things.

In the early part of your ministry, vou were more into the educational aspect of the ministry. Why did you make that choice?

I did not make such choice. My very first experience in the ministry was to serve as Tutelage under two great servants of God, Pastors Ogundiran and J.B. Akande. It was Baba Ogundiran who inspired me to go for formal training at the Bible Training Centre (BTC) Akure, a Christ Apostolic Church Theological Training Institution. After my studies, I was retained as the voungest tutor, at age 19. That was how my sojourn in Christian education began. Subsequently, I lectured at the CACTS He Ife before going on to pastor some of our assemblies.

Having been inaugurated as the 8th

president of CAC Worldwide early in the year, what is your vision for the Church?

We have a three-prong vision to grow the Church: reconciliation, human capital development and evangelism.

The Nigerian Church is believed to part be of the societal decadence. What is your take on this?

If that is with respect to the Church being a subset of the society, yes. However, it is still the Church that gives the modicum of sanity which exists in our society today. We are the salt of the earth and light of the world.

How can the Church help in tackling the social decadence in the country?

> By practising what we preach and rejecting the gifts of those who practise corruption. I believe in the Acts of the Apostles, not just in talks.

The Church has been seriously hit by the insecurity in the country like other sections of the society. What can the Church do in the face of this challenge?



Yes. Aladura means "people of prayer". Christ Apostolics remain some of the most praying group of Christians that I know of in the world. We are a praying Church.

The Church in Nigeria was a major promoter of free education. For instance, you attended CAC Primary School, which was free. This seemed to have changed. What informed this change?

Nothing is entirely free in life. Some people usually pay for those things you call "free". However, to answer your question, the efforts of the Church in subsidising education is largely undermined by the extremely high cost of running organisations in Nigeria, schools inclusive.

hristians in 13 states across the country trooped out in their hundreds with excitement to read the Bible in their preferred languages, as the full Bible was read in four centres within the five days.

The centres where the entire Bible

was read are Christ Anglican Church, Agege; The Eternal Sacred Order of C& S, Abule Egba; Power of Redemption Ministry, Alagbado and First Baptist Church, Ojo, all in Lagos. Only 43 people read the complete Bible at the First Baptist Church.

The Coordinator at the Anglican Church, Agege, Mrs Mary Awoyemi, said people of different social statusmotorcycle riders, artisans, students, etc., were mobilized

to read the Bible and they all read with joy. According to her, the 162 people who participated in the exercise at the centre read the Bible in different languages ranging from Hausa, Igbo, Yoruba, French to English. They read the entire Bible

in four days and repeated Genesis to Numbers on Friday.

Oladimeji Opayemi, a student at Federal University, Oye-Ekiti, participated at the Cherubim and Seraphim Church, Isolo, Lagos, where she read Genesis Chapter 1-25. She said reading the Bible

aloud takes her closer to God and gives her better understanding of the Scriptures. "When I pick up my Bible, I do not usually read Genesis. I know the story of Abraham and Isaac, but I have never read it in the Bible. I want

to thank the BSN which made it possible for me to read Genesis. I am happy that I discovered for myself today where the story of Abraham is in the Bible."

Master Elijah Oloruntimilehin, 12, a student at Estate Primary School, Isolo, Lagos, who was among

participated in the exercise, read Genesis 26-32. He described his participation in the Bible reading exercise as eating a spiritual food and gaining more knowledge. He advised those who do not read their Bible to do so as they can only know God through reading the Scriptures.

The Coordinator of First Baptist Church, Festac, Mr Adebisi, said the attendance has been encouraging as people turned out in their

numbers to participate in the exercise. She said that participants testified that the Bible portions they read were always new to them. According to Mrs Adebisi if people will read and obey God, the

Mrs. Mary Agi, a teacher, said that she had never been able to read two chapters of the Bible but was elated when she successfully read Genesis 4 and 5.

A total of 4,328 participants were part of this year's edition of the Marathon Bible Reading in 121 centres- 63 in Lagos and 58 across 12 other states of the country.

BSN emerges among top 10 in global full Bible Downloads in 2020

he Bible Society of Nigeria (BSN) has been rated among the top 10 countries in Full Bible downloads, the Scripture Distribution Report 2020 released by the United Bible Societies has shown.


The BSN was ranked 9th globally with 200,000 Full Bible Downloads with the Bible Society of Brazil topping the list with 1.72 million downloads, and USA (0.86 million downloads) and Mexico (0.68 million) came second and third respectively.

Bible Society of South Africa led in Africa in Full Bible downloads last year with 0.26 million downloads and was followed by the BSN (0.20 million downloads).


The total Bible downloads increased by 113% year-toyear, underpinned on the impact of global lockdown which characterised greater part of 2020.

Despite the devastating impact the COVID-19 pandemic had on world economy in 2020, Bible Societies distributed 30.9 million copies of full Bibles during that period.

Over 190 million Scripture items, including Bibles, New Testaments, Gospels, and

smaller Scripture portions and selections were distributed globally, which was 37% lower when compared with 2019.

The Bible Society of Nigeria continues to lead in Africa with a Full Bible distribution figure of 1.5m copies

accounting for 25.42 per cent of the total 5.9m copies distributed by over 40 Bible Societies in Africa.

The total full Bibles distributed last year was down by 37% in comparison to 2019, and New Testament distribution declined by 63%.

xing Your Tomorrow today is a book with seven chapters written by Samuel Sanusi to encourage and warn everyone to make effort to plan for tomorrow by making investment that can pay one's bills later in life.

The author establishes three important facts about life on page 6 and asks some pertinent rhetorical questions: "If someone dies too soon, what happens to the people left behind by the breadwinner?" "If one lives for too long, what happens if there is not enough money to take care of the old man/woman? and "If there is permanent disability, how will the breadwinner and his or her dependent be cared for?" He believes that God wants us to prosper and have increase, but everyone has a role to play. The author maintains that to achieve, we must act; to succeed, we must sweat; to reap, we must sow and to triumph, we must travail. According to him, it is wrong to wait for manna to fall. In chapter four of Fixing Your Tomorrow Today, the author explains what he calls the money quadrant which has four parts: the employee, self-employed, business owner and investor. He advises people to move from the level of employee to become an investor, where one's money will be working for them. He opines that employee and self-employed are the two disadvantaged positions because an employee may lose his job while everything revolves around a self-employed whose business may fold up if anything happens to the owner. The business owner has people working for him and may not necessarily have to be there before things can work while an investor allows his money to work for him even while he is sleeping. In chapter five of the book, the author lists several investment options one can take advantage of. They include investment in landed property, insurance policies, forex market, money market instruments, securities, and others. He devotes a lot of space to discuss how to invest in shares of companies and various insurance products. The earliest time you can start investing is now, so pick a copy of the book for a guide on how to go about fixing your tomorrow today. The book can be read in few hours and is reader friendly with a lot of white spaces.

This is the assertion with which Samuel Sanusi sets the tone of his book, The Heart of Nation Building. He claims the youth is the foundation upon which a great nation can be built. The youth he says are energetic, creative, ambitious, but unfortunately are operating in a socio-economic and political environment riddled with cultism, corruption, violence, and other vices. Regrettably, the youth are not getting the required guidance and training that can make a strong foundation for the nation as all the agents of socialization are not living up to expectation. On the contrary, if parents, teachers, the government, and other agents of socialization make deliberate and concerted efforts to bring up the children in a godly way, the foundation of the nation will be solidly laid. The Heart of Nation Building is a passionate appeal to all the relevant parties in character molding of the youth to do everything required to have a better nation. The author outlines some strategies in chapter four of the book that can make lasting impact in raising the youth. He mentions some of the qualities in youth leaders who will help achieve this. They include a born-again youth teacher who must be prayerful, and have a passionate interest in the affairs of the youth. In chapter seven of the book the author recommends the following strategies to impact the lives of the youth: accepting every child as he is, behaving well before them to make a lasting impression, caring for them according to their needs, desiring the best for each child, evangelizing children and youth every day, forgiving them when they err as they will always do, guiding them when confused a n d helping them when in difficulty, among others. The book, which is divided into seven chapters, is recommended for parents, teachers, the clergy, the youth and particularly all those involved in youth and young adult ministry.
