Prayers for our nation

In most cases, according to the Holy Bible, these unpleasant experiences are caused by humans' deviation from the path of God. The case of the children of Israel in the Bible says it all. Whenever human beings want to prove to be wiser than God and try to go their way, it always ends in disaster and calamities. Yet, man has failed to learn from experience, and we have kept making the same mistakes repeatedly going against the laws of God and trying to fulfil what the Bible says in Job 21:22a - ***"Can anyone teach knowledge to God?"***

The Bible has shown us the problems and provided the solutions. The solutions are found in 2 Chronicles 7:13-14 - ***"When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command locusts to devour the land or send a plague among my people, if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."*** Sins bring disasters and untold hardship to man as God will never compromise His standard for anyone - ***"The soul that sins shall die..."*** (Ezekiel 18:20a). ***"Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people"*** (Proverbs 14:34). So, God expects us to humble ourselves before Him in true and sincere repentance, turn away from our evil ways and solution will come. As long as we refuse to go by the counsel of God, we will remain in His woes. It is time to repent and turn to God to heal our land.

The call to prayer is for everyone, especially those of us who see ourselves as God's oracles or ministers of the gospel. He called on his people to seek the face of God in penitent prayer like the Ninevites of old did (Jonah 2-3). The Lord answered by releasing a heavy storm that disrupted the German Air Command's plan to attack Dunkirk, but He (God) allowed serene weather at Dunkirk that enabled the British forces to be evacuated to safety. If you doubt this, read the story of the Israelites in Goshen and at the Red Sea in the book of Exodus.

About 3,000 years before the story above, when the land of Judah was faced with extinction following devastating plagues and drought in the land, Prophet Joel also asked the people to turn to God in repentance from their sins that had attracted God's judgment (Joel 2:12-17). The way out of the challenges tormenting our nation and, of course, the world at large is to find an escape route in God who readily forgives unpretentious evil doers seeking mercy through His Son Jesus Christ. This is a call for all believers in Christ to seize the horn of the altar of intercession and plead with the Almighty to spare His people.

May God find you and I faithful to this call in Jesus' name.



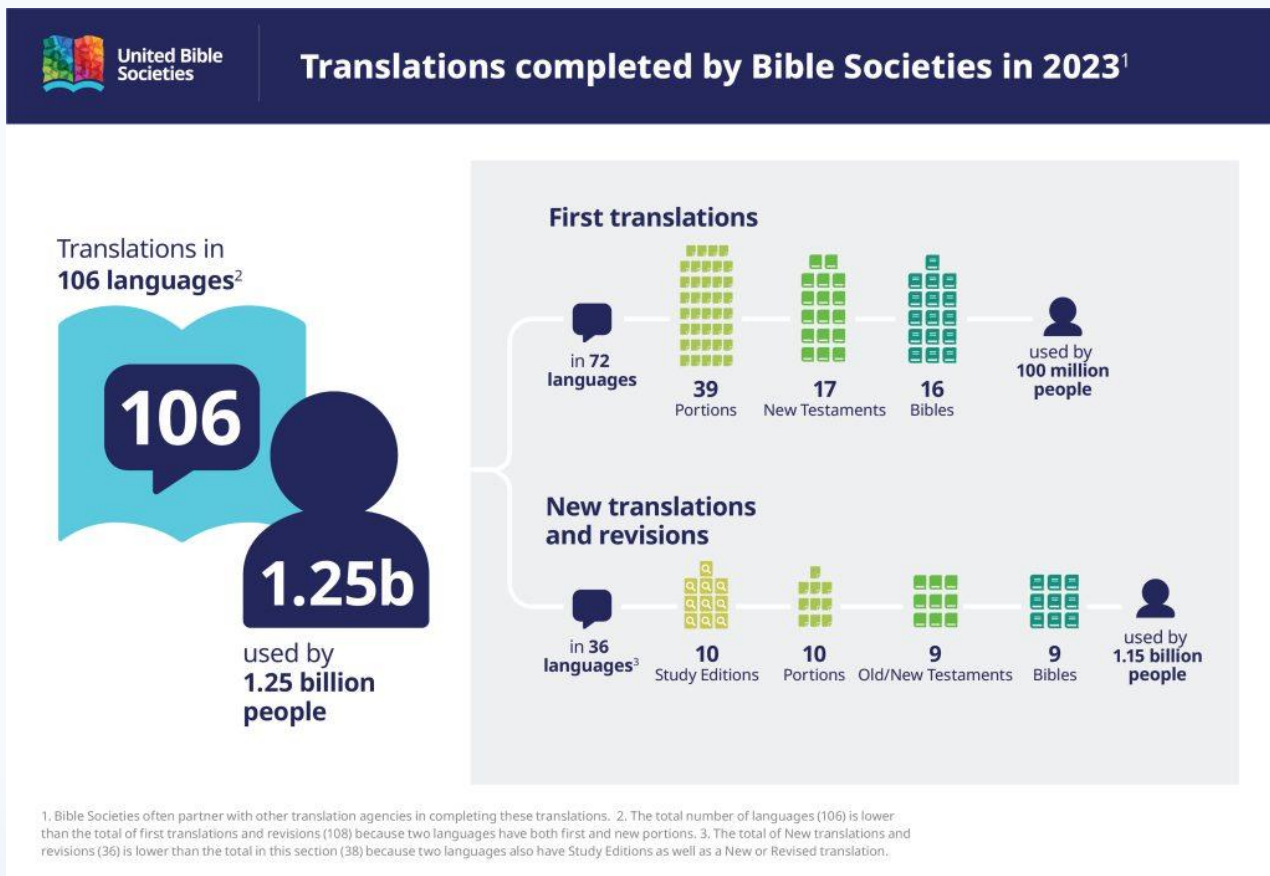

Bible Societies complete Scripture translations for over 1.25 billion people

In 2023, Bible Societies across the world completed Scripture translations in 106 languages, spoken by over 1.25 billion people.

This accomplishment underscores the commitment of Bible Societies to make the Bible accessible to diverse language communities across the globe.

From across the globe, they extended their reach to 72 language groups, benefiting a total of 100 million people who now have more access to the Scripture in their native languages for the first time, while they continued the revision or creating new translations, including study editions in 36 languages spoken by over 1.15 billion people.



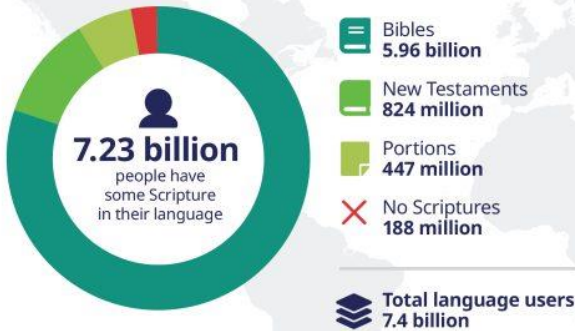
Over 5.96 billion people now have access to Full Bible in their languages

As of the end of 2023, through the collective efforts of Bible Societies and various Bible translation agencies, the full Bible has been made accessible in 743 languages, reaching 5.96 billion people worldwide. Over 70% of these translations were facilitated by the translation teams working with the 155 Bible Societies which are members of the United Bible Societies (UBS) Fellowship.

Only around 60 of the world's 400 sign languages have some Scripture, and only one has the full Bible. Last year, Bible Societies completed additional Scripture portions in 15 sign languages for 2.5 million people.

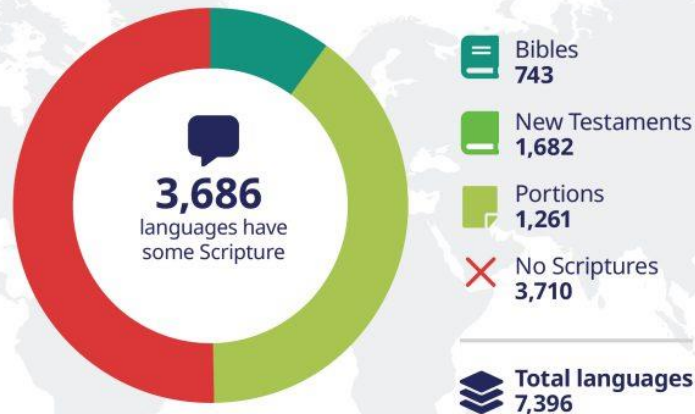
In addition to the full Bible, the New Testament is available in 1,682 languages, while 1,261 languages have specific portions of Scripture. Collectively, this means that approximately 7.23 billion people now have access to some form of Scripture in their mother tongue.

However, the work is far from complete, as 3,710 languages, representing half of the world’s linguistic diversity spoken by 188 million people still lack any form of Scripture. This is why Bible Societies and other translation agencies remain dedicated to their ambitious goal of making Scripture available in every language. The Bible Society of Nigeria (BSN) is currently working on nine different translation/revision projects in different parts of the

country. Out of the over 500 languages in Nigeria, the BSN has only been able to translate the full Bible into 27 languages. It costs a minimum of ₦120m to complete a Bible translation project if achieved in eight years.

The ongoing momentum in Bible translation is attributed to key partnerships with local churches, technological advancements, and steadfast commitment. These factors contribute to the unprecedented progress witnessed in recent years and enhanced quality of translations, bringing us closer to a world where every individual, regardless of their language, can engage with the transformative power of Scripture.

Commitment to achieve 1,200 translations by 2038

Since 2018, the United Bible Societies (UBS) Fellowship has remained focused on a vision to complete 1,200 Scripture translations by 2038. The progress made thus far is inspiring, with 160 translations already completed and an additional 442 currently in progress. Work has not begun on 598 translations, requiring the ongoing commitment and

faithfulness of Bible Societies and their supporters.

This vision reflects the dedication of the UBS Fellowship to ensuring that sacred texts are accessible to an even broader spectrum of communities globally. As they navigate through this extensive undertaking, the Fellowship remains steadfast in its vision to make the Bible available to everyone.

Bible Society donates Bibles worth ₦18.8 million

The Bible Society of Nigeria (BSN) donated assorted Bibles worth ₦18.8 million in the year 2023 as part of its free Bible distribution drive.

Beneficiaries of the free Bibles distributed included prison inmates, churches, Christian fellowships and organisations, schools for the blind, and individual members of the public, among others.

The value of the Bibles donated to the sighted was ₦11.5 million, while the 146 complete sets of Braille Bible given to people with visual disabilities cost ₦7.3 million. This reflects a 12.6% increase over the organisation's free Scriptures worth ₦16.7 million

donated to the less privileged in the year 2022.

A complete set of the Braille Bible, which comes in 37 volumes, costs ₦70,000. The organisation carries out the free distribution programme with funds donated by members of the Bible-A-Month Club, Special Members, corporate organisations, churches, and individual donors for the Braille Bible project - You Can Be Their Eyes (YCBTE).

Through free Bible distribution and other laudable programmes, the BSN has continued to break every known barrier that makes the Word of God inaccessible to people.

BSN joins others to pray for Nigeria

The Bible Society of Nigeria (BSN) joined other Christians to pray for the well-being of Nigeria on April 5, 2024, during the 44th annual National Prayer Breakfast organised by the Christian Laity Association of Nigeria at La Scala Hall, MUSON Centre, Lagos.

The occasion was also used to pray for those piloting the affairs of the country - the Legislative, Executive, and Judicial arms of the government, including the law enforcement agencies, the youths and education, the economy, and the Church of God.

Welcoming members to the prayer meeting, the chairman of the association, Chief Brown Mene, thanked members for coming and appreciated God for answering their prayers.

During an exhortation titled, *“Occupy Till I Come,”* Venerable Godwin Ezumba, encouraged everyone

to identify their gifts and use them to serve God. He said it is tragic for people not to know what God expects from them, thereby living a purposeless life.

He admitted that there could be challenges while people are working for and serving God in different capacities but encouraged them to be of good cheer as Jesus is always available to help. Venerable Ezumba admonished the people not to allow anything to hinder them from serving the Lord.

The Christian Laity Association of Nigeria has six different prayer groups in Lagos State that gather to pray for the country monthly but gather once a year on the first Thursday after Easter to pray for the nation.

INTERVIEW



Surviving difficult times: Defer non-pressing expenditures – Dr. Nwogbo



Dr. Emmanuel Nwogbo is the Group Managing Director of Alfa Centauri West Africa Limited. In this interview with Benjamin Mordi, he advises Nigerians to defer any non-pressing expenditures to alleviate the current economic challenges.

In the interest of our readers, can we meet you, sir?

I am Dr. Emmanuel Nwogbo, the Group Managing Director of Alfa Centauri West Africa Limited. We are into equipment procurement, supply, installation, commissioning, and maintenance. We also do construction in the downstream sector of the oil and gas industry. We have offices in Freetown, Sierra Leone; Monrovia, Liberia, as well as Port Harcourt and Lagos in Nigeria. I am a Christian.

Tell us more about Alfa Centauri.

In addition to what I have said before, we do the design and construction of firefighting systems. We build petroleum storage tanks, pipe installation and related things. About two years ago, we diversified into renewable energy where we do solar energy, inverters, batteries, and related things.

How are you coping with the current economic challenges? A lot of multinationals are declaring losses while some are leaving the country.

It is terrible, I must tell you. If you are not involved in the importation of things directly into the country, you will not understand how bad the situation is. For instance, when you are making your projected profit, one major factor to consider is the exchange rate. The situation is so bad now that we have not been able to do any letter of credit for the past five years, which is the safest and best way to do importation where you the importer and your supplier are both protected against fraud of any kind. That is no longer achievable in this country. We have discovered that the commercial banks are the culprits. How? When you open a letter of credit with the banks, they will give

you “Form M” to state the total invoice value of what you want to bring in and once they confirm that you have naira equivalent based on the prevailing exchange rate, they will debit your account. Four weeks or more after your account has been debited, you will discover that they have not opened your letter of credit. When you ask them for an update, they will tell you they do not have enough dollars. Meanwhile, your supplier is sending you mail consistently, saying how disappointed they are. When you push further, the bank will tell you that they have dollars from their offshore branches to give you as a loan at an exorbitant rate, using your naira which they had taken as collateral. After taking enough interest from you, they will collapse the loan. At the end of everything, you would have lost about eight weeks or more, and all the money spent. There would be little or no difference if you had bought from the black market. Now we are going to the black market because I don’t want the trouble and headache of going through the banks again.

The Nigerian Customs are another big problem that importers have. They behave as if they are competing with importers. As the exchange rate is changing in the black market, they are changing the rate on their portal. There was a day they changed the rate on their portal twice. In the end, the end users bear the brunt because the cost is transferred to them. The ports are congested now because people have abandoned their goods as they cannot afford to pay customs duty to clear their containers.

Considering the current economic challenges, what advice can you give to start-ups?

I wonder how they will even start. Nearly 30 years ago when I set up this company, the exchange rate was about ₦4.20/dollar in the black market and about ₦2.40k in the bank. I remember my father was not happy, saying that I did not know what I was doing, and sent my mother to come and advise me to return to my paid employment. I told my mum that paid employment could not give me what I wanted, so she prayed for me and went back. I started the company with ₦22,000 being my leave allowance from the last place I worked. Then we said the economy was not good. Is the economy good today? Can the same amount or even ₦22m start this kind of company today? What I can tell any start-up is to have the willpower to push forward. The operating environment is not encouraging at all.

However, let me also add that the economic challenges are global; the trouble is everywhere. Whether it is the sign of the end, I do not know.

Today, many youths want money but are not willing to work. What advice can you give them?

It has always been so, may be it is just a little different now. During our time, what was in vogue was a strong desire to go to school. We wanted to go to university, but today, the youth neither want to go to school nor work but they want to be wealthy. We have lost our values. Everyone wants money and nobody is asking what to do to make the money. When I bought my first car and drove it home, my father opened the gate, came outside, and asked who I was. When he discovered I was the one, he asked me about the owner of the car. I said it was mine and he asked where I got money to buy a car. I had to explain how I saved money to buy the car before he allowed me to drive in. Our societal values have been eroded and the consequence is what is happening among our youth. It is from work that money comes.

If you have the opportunity to advise President Bola Tinubu, what will you tell him?

The two major policies of Tinubu responsible for what is happening are the removal of fuel subsidy and the floating of the naira. These are good policies but how we manage them will determine the impact they will have on Nigerians. Was Tinubu not aware at the point of removing the subsidy that it would lead to hyperinflation? He was aware. The question is, what

are the strategies he put in place to manage these consequences? To me, he is not managing the consequences of these policies. To the common man, any policy that will make him pay more for goods and services is not good enough. They are telling us that we need to be patient to enjoy the dividends of the policies, but the people must be alive to enjoy whatever benefit the policies will bring.

Countries are moving away from fossil fuels to renewable energy. Do you think Nigeria is prepared for that?

No, we are not, just as we are never prepared for anything. What will happen is we will be whipped into line. As far back as 2019, all the cars I used when I went to Canada were all electric cars. Countries have even given deadlines on when they will stop using fossil fuels; everybody is looking forward to a clean environment and the way to achieve that is through renewable energy.

As a Christian CEO, have you at any time found yourself in a position where you were under pressure to compromise your Christian ethics and values?

Several times. While looking for credit to execute a contract, I went to a friend in the bank who tried to assist me through his bosses, but it did not work. So, he introduced me to a lady banker. Do you know what the lady asked me? She asked me if I had collateral and I said no because my car then could not be more than ₦3,000 and I was looking for ₦1.2m. The lady wanted me to sleep with her and I told her I was married. She said she too was married. I told her to allow me to think about it and she asked, "What are you thinking? I will make you a big boy; you are asking for ₦1.2m but you could get as much as ₦10m." I went home dejected, but God helped me, and I got the items I needed to buy on credit.

At another time, I went to a textile mill in Ikorodu then. They were the biggest textile mill in the country and were not connected to the national grid; they were using generators 24 hours a day. They were burning three trucks of diesel daily at that time. They had over a dozen purchasing managers. For one year, I went there to supply equipment, but never got any orders. I eventually met the purchasing manager in charge at a wedding ceremony and he gave me an appointment. When we met, he asked if I was willing to do "supply and removal." I asked what he meant by

that. He said if I supplied an item, it would be recorded, then I would take it out and bring it in again for the third time. In their books, it would read that I supplied three items, and I would be paid for the three items, but I would return the money for two to them. I reminded him that such practice is stealing. The man abused me, saying I was calling him a thief, and asked me to leave his office. I told him such an act would kill the company and he said that they were just at the tail of the elephant, that they had not gotten to the main body. I went to the diesel section and discovered that it was the same story, so I stopped going to the company. Today, the company is dead and buried.

What advice do you have for Christians on how to survive this hard economy?

To survive as a company, we created a tool to decide what expenditure to make and the one to defer. We have what we call "Necessary and Pressing". If you bring a request for expenditure, we will put it on that scale. Is it necessary? If it is, we will also consider whether it is pressing because something may be

necessary but not pressing. So, we only approve of what is both necessary and pressing. In your family, look at the bill you do not need. A child is barely one year old, and you take him to a daycare centre where you pay more than what you earn as a salary. List all the expenditures you want to make over a period and face only what is necessary.

How would describe the Bible?

I can describe the Bible as a document God has given to Christians as a gift to enable us to model our lives. It is a tool every Christian must have and depend on in times of difficulty, especially the times we are in now. Everything happening now is documented in the Bible.

Do you have any version of interest?

I don't prefer any version.

What is your favourite Bible verse?

Psalm 113 verse 1 – ***Praise ye the LORD. Praise, O ye servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD.***

Breast Health & Cervical Cancer (Part 4)

Things Women Need to ADD to their Diet and Lifestyle for Improved Breast Health and General Health

To balance hormones, a woman must avoid hormone disruptors such as hormone-laden cow milk, pesticides, and plastic materials and eat hormone-balancing foods such as AVOCADO PEAR, and TIGER NUT. A good way to ingest these is to make smoothies from them. Tiger Nut Milk can easily be made at home by soaking dried Tiger Nuts overnight, blending them in a good blender and using a clean white piece of cloth to squeeze out the milk. Fresh Tiger Nuts do not need to be soaked. Once the milk has been made, pour the Tiger Nut Milk back into your blender, add a peeled avocado pear and a few peeled bananas, and blend them to make a hormone-balancing delicious smoothie. This smoothie can be taken for breakfast with no other food. It is delicious, nutritious, healthful, and very filling. It can sustain you till lunchtime. If you wish, you may add one or more of the following optional healthful ingredients to your smoothie: TURMERIC, OMEGA-3 OIL, COCONUT OIL, GARLIC, GINGER, CEYLON CINNAMON, GREEN LEAFY VEGETABLES, etc.

1. Breastfeeding: Breastfeeding is a major strategy for long-term breast health. I will discuss this in greater detail later in this article.

2. Mastitis: This is most often found in new mothers, usually nursing mothers. Women who are not nursing babies can get it too, but it's not nearly as common. Mastitis can be very painful. Women with mastitis can use warm compresses. Doctors often use antibiotics to help the situation.

3. Supplementation: Supplements could be very useful in caring for a woman's breasts. The most popular breast-supporting supplements out there include but are not limited to the following:

- Indole-3-carbinol (or DIM);
- Swanson's breast health formula;
- A good iodine supplement (e.g. EnerG-Iodine, Iodoral, Iosol, kelp);
- Balanced woman cream, wild yam cream or progesterone cream;
- Lycopene (from tomatoes, watermelon, etc.);
- Vitamin D3;
- Lignans (found in flaxseeds, sesame seeds, etc.);
- Curcumin or turmeric;
- Omega-3 Oils (Fish oil, Udo's oil, flaxseed oil, hemp seed oil, krill oil, etc.); and
- Green tea or green tea extract.

There are oestrogen receptors within the breasts, the womb, and other female organs and glands. Receptors are like sockets to which oestrogen molecules or substances that mimic oestrogen can bind or attach to.

Once a receptor is taken up by oestrogen or any other substance, it is not available to other molecules of oestrogen or substances. Any substance that binds to the oestrogen receptors in the breasts or the womb can be stored there and can affect the health of the breasts and the womb. This situation offers every woman at least some control over which substances take up residence in their breasts or womb. When all or most of the receptors in the womb are taken up by oestrogen, there will be too much oestrogen in the womb and this will stimulate the growth of fibroids in the womb. In the same way, when there is too much oestrogen in the tissues of the breasts, all kinds of breast diseases can develop, ranging from breast lumps to breast cancer. This is the reason I always suggest that women should eat iodine-rich foods or take iodine supplements. Iodine binds to the same receptors as oestrogen. So, if a woman's diet is rich in dietary iodine, then iodine becomes a competitor with oestrogen in the breasts and the womb. Once iodine takes up some of the receptor sites, less oestrogen will concentrate in

the breasts and the womb. This is an indirect way of reducing the amount of oestrogen present in the breasts and the womb per time, thus reducing the incidence of breast diseases as well as uterine fibroids and endometriosis.

Iodine-rich foods include SEA VEGETABLES (e.g. blue-green algae, spirulina, chlorella, brown seaweed, and kelp), organic cranberries, organic strawberries, organic potatoes, tomatoes, onions, garlic, pineapples, grapes, Himalayan crystal salt, Navy beans, bananas, green beans, etc. However, I must state that, apart from sea vegetables and Himalayan crystal salt, all the fruits and vegetables listed above as sources of dietary iodine must have been grown on iodine-rich soil for them to contain any iodine at all. Iodine is a trace mineral. Even though plants, animals, and humans can synthesise vitamins, no living thing can manufacture minerals. They must be obtained from the soil or water on which they grow.

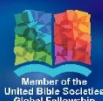
